

PROCLAMATION Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month February 2010

WHEREAS, studies have found that one in five teenagers in a serious relationship

reported that they have been hit, slapped or pushed by a partner; and

WHEREAS, one in four teenagers have been in a relationship where a partner has been

verbally abusive toward them; and

WHEREAS, thirty percent of teenagers in a dating relationship have received text

messages throughout the day by a partner attempting to find out where

they are, what they are doing or who they are with; and

WHEREAS, twenty-nine percent of teenage girls who have been in a relationship said

that they have been pressured to have sex or engage in sexual activities

that they did not want; and

WHEREAS, sixty-nine percent of all teenagers who had sex by the age of 14 said that

they have experienced abuse, either verbal or physical, while in a

relationship; and

WHEREAS, the severity of violence among intimate partners has been shown to be

greater in cases where patterns of violence were established during

adolescence.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that I, Jerry Ellis, Mayor of the City of Farmington Hills, on behalf of the City Council, do hereby proclaim February 2010 as Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month in the City of Farmington Hills and encourage citizens to learn more about preventing teen dating violence and show support for organizations that provide critical advocacy, service, and assistance to victims.
